


## Italian

- Go global with your knowledge of Italian as a second language. Join over 50 million people worldwide who speak Italian. Start each day with “buon giorno” and end with “ciao!”



- Broaden your understanding and appreciation of the language with a culture-based communicative approach to studying Italian.


- Oak Ridge High School offers a complete four-year program in Italian.

## Spanish


