Welcome to the 2018-19 school year. We are excited to begin the year we have planned for your students. Oak Ridge students are fortunate to have access to many amazing opportunities. We continue to offer one of the best academic programs in the state. In addition, our students have access to nine college and career pathways, four different world languages, a champion Academic Decathlon team and so much more. Year after year our students continue to dazzle us and graduate as highly proficient college and career ready young adults. Whether it is academics, the arts or athletics our students are achieving at the highest levels.

With all of this success Oak Ridge will continue to be an institution that is driven by the growth mindset. That mindset is based on the goals shown below. These have been our focus for the preceding 3 years and we will continue with that focus in the coming year.

Goals:

1. Teachers will implement and refine instructional strategies to provide in-class interventions for underperforming students in order to close the achievement gap.
2. The school will improve the social emotional health of their students as indicated in the California Healthy Kids Survey.
3. Staff and administration will continue to make schoolwide decisions based on data to support achievement of all students.

Goal one and two are passions of mine and most of our staff. We are working with the Assessment Training Institute to bring the power of formative assessment and mastery teaching to bear on goal number one. At the start of this school year Oak Ridge will have half the faculty trained in mastery teaching and highly effective formative assessment strategies to close the achievement gap with our underperforming students.

The social emotional health of teens across the nation is poor. No previously tested generation has had lower social emotional indicators on state assessments than our current generation. Weekly the news brings us another story about the struggle this generation is having with depression, anxiety, unhealthy stress and loneliness. Our students are not an exception. As I stated last year, we have partnered with Stanford University's Challenge Success to improve the social emotional health of our students. Clearly teens are facing societal issues that are larger than just the schools; however education does play a large factor in the dilemma. Oak Ridge is committed to doing the hard work that is required to help our students. We have started by partnering with the leader in this change. We look forward to sharing the additional changes that are coming this year.

Oak Ridge has been a big believer in teacher collaboration for many years. The research on achieving highly effective teacher collaborations continues to evolve and so we will evolve with it. The biggest change for us will come with goal three. In the previous school year we worked with a Professional Learning Community (PLC) expert from ASCD (The Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development) to reinvent our PLCs. We will continue to have this expert train our PLC teacher leaders this school year as well. We are determined to have teacher collaboration focused on student achievement data and how this data can help us improve student achievement.
