

## 2021 AP Exam Registration

Taking the Advanced Placement exams is an important part of all AP courses. Oak Ridge High School highly encourages all students take AP exams for the AP classes they are enrolled. Scoring well on an AP exam can earn student's college credit, enhancing the college application and saving a significant amount on tuition.

For the 2021 AP exams, students at Oak Ridge High School will register online. **This will be a two-step process.** The registration will take a few minutes and can be completed from any computer with internet access.

**This year each AP exam will cost \$95.00.** Students have the option to pay for the exam(s) in full at this time, or place a \$40 deposit per exam. **Step One:** Go to [www.myap.collegeboard.org](http://www.myap.collegeboard.org), sign into your student account, and join your AP Classroom(s).

*Joining the College Board AP Classroom **does not** order the student an AP exam. Total Registration must be used to order and pay for each exam.*

**Step Two:** Online exam registration to pay for your exam will begin on Monday, September 14, 2020 at 8:00 AM and end on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 3:59 PM. To order, students should click on the link provided on the school website or visit [www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/050818](http://www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/050818) to purchase the exam. The purchase is not complete until students have printed the pdf of the confirmation page that is provided at the end. **We strongly recommend that parent and student are both present while registering to ensure that the correct exams are ordered and the STUDENT name is entered correctly.**

Please be sure to have a credit card or debit card available before beginning registration. Student/Parent will choose whether to pay their entire balance without an additional fee or make a partial payment for a fee of \$2.75 charged by Total Registration.

Here are the important dates for the registration process:

- *Monday, Sept. 14, 2020 at 8:00 AM - Registration Begins*
- *Monday, Nov. 9, 2020 at 3:59 PM – Registration and payments after this date will incur a \$40 late fee per Exam.*
- **NOTE:** *Spring AP Government will **NOT** incur a late fee. Registration for these classes can occur until the March 9th Deadline.*
- *Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 3:59 PM - Registration Ends*
- *Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 3:59 PM - Registrations not paid in full will be canceled and exams will not be ordered.*


**IMPORTANT AP TESTING UPDATE & FINAL DEADLINE TO REGISTER FOR AN AP EXAM**

- Tuesday, March 9, at 3:59 pm will be the last opportunity to register and pay for an AP exam
- Wednesday, March 10, at 3:59 pm – Students who have not paid for their exam will not be able to test, as an exam will not be ordered.

The College Board released their AP testing calendar for spring 2021. Testing this year is complicated by California Public Health guidance regarding indoor seating capacity restrictions.



In order to administer all AP exams prior to May 28, Oak Ridge will utilize College Board’s Administration 1 and 2 testing windows.

Administration 1 will be on campus paper and pencil exams.

Administration 2 will utilize a combination of on campus paper and pencil exams and at home digital testing. If an AP exam conflicts with a final exam, alternative arrangements will be made for the final exam.
