



El Dorado Union High School District 9th Grade

Placement at this time is based on grades from previous course and end of course final exam results. In the future, 8° grade Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) Summative Assessment scores will assist with student placement as well.

The El Dorado Union High School District (EDUHSD) requires middle school teachers to make initial placement recommendations in January for scheduling purposes. However, final middle school teacher recommendations will be submitted by June 1. Middle school teachers are asked to follow the placement criteria outlined below when submitting final recommendations. Parents wishing to appeal the middle school teacher's placement shall submit at written request detailing the grounds for appeal to the high school principal. The written appeal will be shared with the student's guidance counselor and the high school's mathematics department chair. The principal will make the final decision regarding placement.

Algebra Foundations

This course is designed for students entering high school below grade level. This course will prepare students for success in our Algebra 1 course. Topics include math computation and pre-algebra concepts with a CA State Standards focus. This course is currently going through revision in order to best meet the needs of 9th grade students who have been enrolled in 8° grade CA State Standards math.

Textbook: California Big Ideas Math Advanced 1, Big Ideas Learning, LLC/ Holt-McDougal, 2015

Middle School Teacher Recommendation Criteria:

For students who failed to master 8th grade mathematics grade level standards and are entering high school with below grade level skills as measured by course marks and summative assessment results.

Algebra 1

This course is designed for students at grade level. Topics in this course are CA State Standards based and include solving multi-step and absolute value equations, solving proportions, solving a system of equations algebraically, solving and graphing compound inequalities, grading absolute value inequalities and systems of inequalities, graphing linear equations and systems of linear equations, writing equations of lines between two points and of lines parallel and perpendicular to a line and a given point, simplifying exponential expressions, function notation, evaluating and graphing functions, multiplying and factoring polynomials, solving quadratic equations by factoring, the quadratic formula and completing the square, operations with rational expressions and constructing and analyzing box and whisker plots for a set of data.

Textbook: Algebra 1, Pearson, 2015-CA edition

Middle School Teacher Recommendation Criteria:

For students who have successfully mastered 8th grade mathematics grade level standards as measured by course marks and summative assessments.

This course continues to develop the four skills of communication (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) and to deepen knowledge of cultures of the Italianspeaking world. Grammar from level 1 to 3 is reviewed. Italian is the primary language of classroom communication and instruction. Students are provided language-use activities that enable them to (1) function in an informal and most formal settings: (2) understand the main ideas and supporting details in concrete, factual, and some abstract texts (oral/written); produce language beyond the paragraph, simple narration, description and explanation: (3) deal with topics related to the external environment: (4) comprehend and produce oral/written paragraphs and essays; and (5) comprehend and be understood by nonsympathetic natives.

JAPANESE 1 (Y) PREREQUISITE: Grade C or better in English; interest in Japanese language and culture. GRADES CREDIT 9-12 5 units per semester Meets UC Requirement: "e"

Japanese 1 develops the four skills of communication: listening, speaking, reading and writing, and explores cultures of the Japanese-speaking world. Students are provided language-use activities that enable them to function in common daily settings for which they have rehearsed understand learned words and phrases in unfamiliar texts (oral/written) and produce learned words and phrases: deal with discrete elements of life; comprehend and produce memorized material orally and in writing; and comprehend and be understood by sympathetic Japanese sneakers






